CORONATION

The first part of May is dominated by the coronation of King Charles. It prompted me to forage through our archive and I came across a programme of Ipplepen festivities from June 1911 celebrating the coronation of their majesties King George V and Queen Mary.



Here are some of the gems from this programme:

8a.m. – National Anthem sung on the Church Tower. All children over the age of 10 are invited to attend.

11a.m. – Service in the Parish Church. After the service all children invited to assemble in Silver Street and march to the Cross where, after singing, each will receive a cake and a bottle of Mineral Water.

From 3p.m. – Sports including for Boys aged 11-14 a 'Bun Eating Contest' with the first prize of a Coronation Knife.

For Boys of 6-8 there was a Crawling Race with the first prize of a Musical Instrument.

For girls of 12-16 there was a 'Needle Threading Race' with first prize of a Teapot and for Women over 40 a Polishing Competition with first prize of a Coronation Biscuit Box.

All of the events followed at 9.30 - 11p.m. by a display of fireworks provided by Mr. Graham of Ambrook ands a bonfire on Great Biltor lit by Mr. Maddicott.
