

Shilstone Trip

Back in June during the blisteringly hot weather a party from the Local History Group paid a visit to Shilstone Manor House near Modbury. Besides being well worth a visit, it also is the venue of the Devon Rural Archive. We were fortunate to have the services of Abigail Gray as our guide. Abigail is the curator of the archive, and she was able to take us through the chequered history of the Manor with its significant rebuilds. Starting off as a medieval manor house the building was acquired and much developed by the Savery family in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. As part of the tour, you are invited to appreciate the changes in architectural styles from 1600 to 1730 and the loving restoration work carried out over the last twenty years under the auspices of the current owners, the Fenwick family. The formal gardens provide an elegant background for wedding parties and a special feature is the only known and nationally important water theatre in the United Kingdom.
