### **Ipplepen Community Fund**

Many of you will be aware of the existence of the Ipplepen Community Fund, which has distributed in excess of £60,000 to help with many projects serving the community of Ipplepen since its inception over 10 years ago. The fund offers small-scale grants (typically £250-£1,500) to "not for profit" organisations for one-off projects that support the community e.g. capital expenditure or equipment purchases, but not on-going expenditure.

As a reminder, the principal source of income for the Fund has been donations from the Ipplepen Cottage Garden Society from surplus monies arising from the annual Village Show and Ipple Tipple beer/cider festival, but the fund is open to donations for other sources - all would be gratefully received!

The Community Fund is administered by a formally constituted committee consisting of representatives from the Cottage Garden Society, Parish Council, St Andrews Church, Methodist Church, Primary School and Health Centre, plus a number of co-opted members. This committee continues to ensure that the Fund supports a thriving and sustainable community life in our village and is happy to receive and review appropriate grant applications from properly constituted clubs, societies and organisations.







Sally Nex, who feeds her family all year round with her fruit and vegetable produce, spoke to us about Seed Saving. Using seed from your own crops saves gardeners a lot of money, because not only are they free, they last much longer than bought packets. It's important not to save seeds from F1 varieties though. When you buy a packet, it will say whether it's an F1 variety. One example of an easy plant to try is the tomato. Pick your best ripe one, cut it in half and scoop out the seeds. Space them out on kitchen roll to dry for 2 weeks on the windowsill. Store the seeds in an envelope and plant in spring. Never store seeds in a plastic bag.

We are going to hold a seed swap as part of our January 2025 meeting. People will be able to come along and swap/take any seeds (flowers and vegetables) that they would like. Our meetings are open to everybody, you don't have to be a member to take part. Please can everyone keep any unwanted seeds for this event. Thank you very much.



Report on Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> February 2024 for a more detailed report please read the draft minutes (yet to be approved at our next meeting) on our website: www.ipplpenparishcouncil.gov.uk

#### CORRESPONDENCE RECEIVED;

- a) James Menzies Agreed unanimously that Mr Menzies is as he states in his latest email dated 1 Feb 2024 is acting on behalf of the house builder. We have not asked or instructed them to act on our behalf so do not feel we are responsible for any costs he has accrued.
- b) Garden Party Coun.Rattlidge and wife would like to attend Action Clerk to complete the forms.
- c) Cold Callers Agreed it should be passed to Village Magazine with a suggestion of including it to warn residents.
- d) Football Club. Parish Council congratulates Football Club for all they are doing Action Clerk to you contact Dave Manning and arrange a date and time for our annual inspection.
- e) Landing Lights 3G switched off Cllr Carnell has tested the lights.
- f) Airband Action Clerk to invite them to present at September meeting.

#### DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT:

Teignbridge District Council has been shown to be in the top ten councils in England for the action being taken to reduce its carbon footprint according to a recent independent net zero survey following a major programme of decarbonisation carried out on the Council offices and Leisure Centres. There is still a great deal to do and TDC are continuing to support organisations and groups committed to improving the environment.

Teignbridge Lottery for Communities distributed small grants of up to £2500 to 15 good causes £13,000 plus additional funding of £20,000 from the Economic Vulnerability Fund.

Planning continues to be an ongoing issue with TDC taking positive action to reduce the 'backlog' of applications and effort into current projects and future planning to ensure that any developments across the District are done in a way that minimises the carbon footprint. I am pleased to have been able to support the Ipplepen Scouts in their brilliant initiative of introducing a "Squirrels' section for younger children with a donation of £300 from the Councillor Community Fund.

#### **County Councillor's Report**

Devon County have announced there will be a double digit increase in cash for children and more money for adult care, climate change and transport in the target budget for 2024/25.

New figures agreed at Cabinet show a proposed 10.4% increase in the budget for children's services with a 6% rise in adult services and 4.7% extra for climate change, environment and transport. The 9.8% increase in the national living wage announced by the Government last year mean an additional £25.7 million has had to be added to the target budget to cover the cost.

Reductions in other departmental spending means an overall rise of 6.3% in our budget for next year with a total spend of over £743 million.

The director of finance, Angie Sinclair, said: "Local authorities across the country continue to

face financial challenges due to high inflation and interest rates as well as demands on local service provision."

Full council debated the budget on 15<sup>th</sup> February and sadly the new DCC Council Tax for a Band D property goes up by 4.99% to £1,715.67.

Devon's Cabinet have approved the Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plans (LCWIPs) which set out priorities for developing cycling and walking improvements in a number of areas of the county.

LCWIPs put us in the strongest possible position for bidding for Government funding for walking and cycle schemes, as well as leveraging external grants and for negotiations with developers.

While supporting increased walking and cycling levels across Devon, the plans also support the County Council's response to the climate crisis, improve health and wellbeing, access for all, as well as delivering economic benefits in the county.

The plan for Teignbridge, covering Newton Abbot, Kingsteignton and Kingskerswell, sets out walking and cycling proposals along five key corridors.

At the same meeting the Cabinet approved plans which set out priorities for electric vehicle charging in Devon.

The EV strategy outlined plans to Reduce carbon emissions in Devon; accelerate the uptake of EVs in Devon; help ensure that the transition was accessible for all and equitable; maximise social value and community benefit; maximise the contribution EVs could make to our local economy, including through increased tourism and contribution to the Council's goal to achieve carbon neutrality by 2030.

# The Church In Ipplepen



Remembering names has never been my strong point! I have got used to it and tend to be up front with people now and admit it from the start! There have been both embarrassing and comical situations over the years, trying to put the right name to the right face. With regard to the plant world, names have always been a confusion - why after years of enjoying the bright colours of my Gran's geraniums, did I find out that they are actually pelargoniums? The sprawling ground cover plants in my first garden turned out to be really useful geraniums, not just pretty, they had a function too!

This year I have missed my Christmas roses flowering. Seeing some just coming out in a friend's garden I shared my disappointment that mine weren't doing anything. So I have learnt that the leaves should have been trimmed back, and yes I do have belated buds beginning to burst into flower that I can see now that the old leaves have gone. My Christmas roses have become Lenten roses for this year!

I also have a Christmas cactus in the house. That flowered around early November, but I have also known it to flower at Easter in other years as well as at the 'right' time indicated by it's name. (It's floral time keeping is probably related to the haphazard care it gets from me.)

Christmas and Easter are two different religious celebrations, but, you can't have one without the other! The baby in the manger grew through childhood to be the man crucified on a cross whose resurrection on that first Easter Day is inextricably linked to Christmas. Just as the joy of my plants depend on how I look after them, the joy of Easter is linked to our efforts to grow in the faith that we have been given as we journey through life. Fellowship, be it at worship, meetings, study sessions, with friends over a cup of tea or on a walk, can offer good tips on how nurture our faith. Lent is a time to share and grow into a happy and blessed Easter.



#### Village hall talk.

I apologise for not posting an article in last month's magazine. An article was produced but it helps to press send on the computer if you want other people to see it!

Last month's article was given over to promoting the talk by Rosemary Griggs which took place in the Village Hall in February. Here are some of the points I made about Rosemary if you are interested in her background.



Since retiring from the Civil Service Rosemary has finally found the time to devote herself to her real passion – which is the study of History. She started as a National Trust volunteer at Compton Castle and as part of her work there was invited to get involved with making a Tudor costume. Despite not having done any dressmaking since school she agreed. With her characteristic energy she went further than expected following an online course on the history of royal fashion and reading extensively around the subject.

As she got more into the history of the sixteenth century, she became fascinated by one woman in particular who was connected to Compton Castle. Lady Katherine Champernowne was the mother of the explorers, Sir Walter Raleigh, and Sir Humphrey Gilbert. In parallel with researching Katherine's life Rosemary started talking to visitors in period costume.

In addition to these performances, she has authored a novel dramatizing Lady Katherine's life. 'A Woman of Noble Wit' was published in 2021. She is now working on a second book, about a lesser-known woman in the same extended family.

**General Comments:** Quite a curious month; wet at the beginning, wet at the end with a prolonged dry and cold spell in the middle. There were also two more named storms this month – Storm Isha at the beginning of the month and Storm Jocelyn towards the end. Once again, Ipplepen and most of the surrounding area avoided the worst of their ire although we did experience some of their peripheral influences.

Statistically, January is our third wettest month of the year with an average of 129.8 mm of rain. Our rainfall this January was almost exactly at that average with 19 wetter years in the thirty eight since our records began. About 55% of this month's rain fell in the first week with the remainder falling in the last ten days. This distribution mirrors the influence of our two storms. Both lots of heavy rain brought some flooding and travel disruption. Six days received rainfall of 10 mm or more including three of 20 mm or more although the wettest day only produced just over 24 mm of rain. We saw light falls of snow on the 8th and 9th but too little to settle. The net result of all of this was a very high total number of dry days which has only been exceeded four times and equalled once since 1987. Our normal expectation would be about 12 or 13 dry days.

The maximum temperature was just into the upper third of our data but the minimum temperature was the fourth lowest we have noted and fully 3.7C° below the mean. Some in the village reported temperatures as low as -8°C but mine is a little warmer! Although several of those maxima were in double figures (12) we only managed to record an average maximum temperature well into the lower half of our record. However, with only 9 minimum temperatures above 5°C, the average minimum temperature was fully 1.4C° below the mean – just nine times since 1987 have we experienced a lower average minimum. Together, these combined to produce an average

temperature for the month of 5.15°C, about 0.75C° below the long term average and the eleventh lowest we have noted. We had 13 days with temperatures at or below zero which is just about the norm. The wind direction was westerly at the beginning and end of the month but mainly easterly in the middle when we experienced the lowest temperatures. The strongest gusts came at the beginning and end of the month and peaked at just over 38 mph (Near Gale, Force 7). The wind run was 2275 miles, below average but not dramatically so.

The barometer reached a fairly impressive 1039 mb and touched a deepish low of 979 mb.

In many ways, a typical January but with the colder, drier weather bracketed by pretty continuous moderately heavy rain but still with opportunities to get out and about with the appropriate garb.

**Out and About:** Many of our regular garden birds have been seen this month including the Greater Spotted Woodpeckers, Nuthatches, Wrens and Dunnocks. Those little lollipops, the tiny Long-tailed Tits have also visited frequently together with their Great and Blue cousins. Their appetites have been voracious and their song glorious! The Robins, Blackbirds and Pigeons have been regulars and the Magpies continue to bully their way around. Frequent thawing of the birdbath was appreciated! On many evenings we picked up the screeches of Owls (Tawny?) but were unable to spot them.

As we might expect, insect sightings have been quite low but the Winter Moth and the Plume Moth have been seen from time to time, plenty of spiders, too! Not unexpectedly, no butterflies have been spotted.

The snowdrops began to flower this month but later than usual and some of our crocuses are just beginning to bloom. Daffodils are thriving although none of ours are yet in flower. We also have daisies, primroses and snowflakes all in full bloom. Many of the garden shrubs and hedgerow plants have also started to bud and the Quince is starting to blossom. One of our Camelias is also flowering and laden with buds which will thrill us later on.

Nicolas de Kingdon, a wealthy landowner wanted to marry Dionysia, a beautiful young girl. She rejected him. Nicolas wasn't happy and in revenge he killed her suitor. Unfortunately for him as well as killing the suitor he stabbed himself with the poisoned dagger he had made so died too.He left his lands to the Abbey and was given a big tomb. Every 3rd July the ghost of Dionysian was seen at the tomb. Even when the calendar became out of sync by 11 days the ghost still walked until in 1906 bones were dug up and moved to the Holy Bones chapel and Lady Dionyisia has not been seen again.

Another tale related to Napoleon who was beaten at the Battle of Waterloo in 1815. He eventually ended up on a ship under Captain Maitland called the Billy Ruffian. He thought he was safe and the ship was eventually brought to Brixham. The public wanted to see him and paid money to be taken out to view him on board.1,500 boats a day went out to see him. He never did land in England although there is a rumour that he did land in Brixham with Admiral Craddock. He was eventually taken to St. Helena where he died.

Mary thanked our Quiz team who took part in the Devon Quiz. They did not win but held their own and really enjoyed themselves. Well done.


